Promote awareness of the principles and goals of the Nobel Peace Prize-winning Pugwash Conferences.











A youth initiative that aims to encourage crossnational dialogue among young professionals working to address the increasingly complex nuclear landscape in South Asia.

South Asia Programme

- <u>Past roundtables:</u> In 2022-23: Two virtual roundtables.
- Perspectives on contemporary nuclear issues in South Asia and the "cyber-nuclear nexus" + a scenario-building exercise.

- Participants from India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka & Nepal.
- Partners: Institute of Peace and Conflict Studies (IPCS), Centre for Security, Strategy and Policy Research (CSSPR), and Nepal Institute for International Cooperation and Engagement (NIICE).



Why the ISYP South Asia Programme?

- Geopolitical hotspot: Southern Asia, with three nuclear-armed states (India, Pakistan, China), is a critical region where nuclear risks are under-represented in the global discourse that traditionally focuses on the US-Russia-China triad.
- **Promoting dialogue:** Past participants have emphasised the importance of initiatives such as ISYP South Asia roundtables in understanding "what the other side is thinking."
- Safe and inclusive space: Past participants expressed their enthusiasm for having a platform to discuss nuclear issues without political sensitivities hindering dialogue, and to encourage honest and open conversations.
- Addressing research gaps: Aims to fill the gap in research and discourse on South Asian perspectives in the nuclear field, and support young professionals with the tools to contribute.

Our Plan for the PACEY Award



Form early-career Working Groups: Organise regionally and thematically-focused groups over a 6-8 months cycle to engage in an interdisciplinary dialogue on nuclear risks, de-escalation and disarmament.



Expert engagement and roundtables: Invite regional and international experts to participate in roundtable discussions on various topics.



Provide regional insights: The fellowship will culminate in a project report co-authored by the participants, tentatively entitled "South Asian Perspectives on Advancing Nuclear Disarmament."



Offer honoraria for Working Group participants: Recognise their contributions and remove financial barriers to participation, encouraging inclusivity and allowing a wider range of voices to participate in the dialogue.
